The webinar will serve as a platform to discuss the working-paper by **Cristina Teleki** (University of Maastricht) entitled 'Competition Law as Justice – The Advent of the De-Oligarchisation Laws in Georgia, Moldova and Ukraine'.

*While the European Commission requested Moldova in its application for membership of the European Union to implement a commitment to “de-oligarchisation”, scholars of oligarchy argue that oligarchy has never been achieved through peaceful means. Against this background, the webinar will serve as platform to explore this conundrum using as a case study the de-oligarchisation laws of Moldova, Georgia and Ukraine and the role of competition law thereof. We will ask a question whether oligarchy can be construed as a form of injustice that arises from predatory behaviour and whether competition law can be seen as a justice “control” that can be exercised to prevent democracies from backsliding into oligarchy.*
